#### **SMILE Scholars' Success**

Our SMILE scholars continue to blaze a trail every year. Sayantan Basak from Gangarampur High School ranked 8th in the West Bengal state secondary board exam, scoring 97.5%. His father has a small shop. Sayantan wants to be doctor.

Over all the SMILE Scholars graduated with high first division scores.

## **AALO Study and Coaching Homes**

Ghatsila AALO Homes' students have seen a significant improvement in their performance on key tests. All the students, despite their difficult circumstances, achieved a 1st division ranking in their secondary school board exam. While results are still coming in, there is a 97% or better pass rate in all high school coaching home centers.

We were able to support their learning by providing DigiTabs - computer tablets with pre-installed course and practice materials. Our sincere and motivated teachers Asit Baran Hui (Math) and Supriya Das (English) nurtured them. They are dedicated Lily volunteers.

#### **New Book Banks and Science Labs**

We inaugurated Heera Moti Reading Hall in Dhulai, Bankura, This space will allow free access to reference books, CDs, seminars and has the capacity to accommodate 30 students.

We added a Science Lab and Book-bank at Jhanjhia High School, Balichak, Purba Midnapore. We thank Dr Meenakshi and Anirudh Maitra for sponsoring the lab, and Mousumi and Tuhin Chatterjee for the book bank.

We opened another book bank at Kashida, Ghatsila. Thanks to Anupriya and Ritesh Verma for their sponsorship. Three new labs at Ghatsila, Baharagora and Ganjam (Orissa) have been planned.

#### **Vocational & Computer Centers**

We opened our 15th Computer Training Center at BDSL Mahila College in Ghatsila, Jharkhand. This is a girls' residential college for the underprivileged and the center will help train 150 students annually. We thank Sunandan Sen his sponsorship.

Two new centers at Homball (Karnataka) and Baharagora are set to open soon. We have added 3 sewing machines to our women's vocational center at Narrah, raising the total student strength to 17. Ms. Sen, an alumni of this program has started a small business from her home.

#### **Medical and Healthcare Services**

We have a number of programs to help with the medical needs of the communities living around our existing centers. The Nivedita Womens' Center at Narrah, holds regular clinics for womens' preventative care. This center also runs a mobile medical unit.

Dhulai DMS center campus organized blood donation and eye check-up camps:

- 132 people donated blood
- 320 patients had their eyes checked
- 100 glasses were distributed and
- some referred for cataract surgery

Another medical camp was held at Berhampore (Orissa) in partnership with Rotary club, 157 patients attended this camp.
